### The need to reinvent energy audits

The EU funded *INNOVEAS Project* addresses the challenge of SME adoption of the practices needed to complete their green transition. Its focus is on the role of energy auditors and the adoption of energy efficiency measures as part of the transition process. The main finding so far is that the EU is unlikely to achieve its ambition in relation to SME partition in the green transition, based on the current model of adoption.

## The role of SMEs to radically improve energy efficiency

Energy efficiency is only one of the range of measures that companies need to adopt. Often, it is not the best place for a small company to start its journey to carbon neutrality. For the vast majority of small companies, a business logic for adoption based on cost savings alone, will not provide sufficient motivation to change. Energy auditing is an important part of the adoption process.

These and related ideas were echoed in a recent meeting of contractors of EU funded energy efficiency projects, organized on October 8-9, 2020, where participants insisted on the need to change the narrative around energy audits and re-invent the business of auditing.

The good news is that there are promising ways to move forward, and with the right steps it should be possible to move onto a whole new level of performance in terms of the support that SMEs need to help them make the transition.
